#### A. DIVISIONAL MISSION AND PURPOSE

## "Will You Help George and Betty?" Regional Pilot Project

**SDS Seniors** - The Alberta Network of Seniors Related Organizations (ANSRO) requested expressions of interest from communities and senior-serving organizations in Alberta to serve as Pilot Sites for a project to field test a model for managing integrated services for seniors. Work has begun on the project with partners from Edson, Wildwood, Evansburg and areas in Yellowhead County and into Parkland County. This is a 3 year Pilot project that is intended to create a model that will be used province wide.

# Shared Living Project Wrap-up

**SDS Housing and Youth** - Group home options for those with social, health or disability needs requiring additional supports and, where feasible, include support services related to needs of special populations. Contacts have been made with appropriate agencies and their interest is established. A group home facility is secured but unable to secure 3 families with eligible needs. There needs to be more interest from a town of this size in order to make this project feasible.

## Home Support

**SDS Seniors** - Expand in-home care and provide opportunities for seniors remaining in their homes to alleviate demand for institutional care and stress on family caregivers. Successfully completed 1.5 years of Home Support in Hinton and always building on the program as the community needs grow. Snow shovelling has been added to the list of Home Support services and will continue to gain momentum into 2013.

**SDS Seniors and Youth** - Create a senior-friendly community by supporting the provision of diverse services for seniors. This school year 2012/2013 is the first year LinkAGES has been happening in Services for Individuals and Families Program **KRA** - Social Well Being

#### **OPERATIONAL ENHANCEMENT INITIATIVES**

#### **KRA:** Customer Service and Social Well Being

The Alberta Network of Seniors Related Organizations (ANSRO) requested expressions of interest from communities and senior-serving organizations in Alberta to serve as Pilot Sites for a project to field test a model for managing integrated services for seniors. Hinton FCSS partnered with Edson FCSS, Yellowhead County FCSS and a representative from Evansberg, in a regional application that will target services across Yellowhead County and into Parkland County. This application was approved and work will begin in December 2012, and continue through 2013.

### **KRA**: Customer Service and Public Engagement

Serve on a Board for a not for profit agency. Services Coordinator is currently serving on the board for HIVWY as the Board Chair and will be complete the 2 year term for Board Chair by the next business plan.

## **KRA**: Customer Service

Offer community workshops and learning opportunities. Schedule workshops and events in a way that focuses on finding ways to reach the community about programs in an informational and cost effective way. Review workshops offered and form partnerships with other FCSS in the area (Edson, Jasper, Yellowhead County) to make it as cost effective as possible.

#### **KRA**: Social Well Being

Early Childhood Mapping Project - This mapping is done and results compiled. The Individuals and Families Service Coordinator will be using creative outreach to help get the community on board with the changes that need to be made to support our preschool aged children before they go to school. The Coordinator will also use creative outreach to help families improve their

child's readiness for school in all five pillars that are addressed in the Mapping Project information.

KRA: Customer Service and Social Well Being

Seniors teas will be held in the colder months of October though April. The teas are better attended in the winter and this allows for the service to still be offered at a smaller cost.

**1 FTE position** 35 hours a week; wages and benefits commensurate with new Union Agreement, passed by Council)

2 PTE contract positions up to 20 hours a week each for a total of 40 hours
