BGC Wolf Creek

The BGC of Wolf Creek has partnered with Bentley School to start an After School and School Out Day Program. An after school program operates during the school year and includes life-skills, leadership training, recreation, planned activities and nutritional snacks to students from 3:30-5:00 pm. The school out day program offers the same programming but operates on professional development days, in lieu days, spring break and some inclement weather days.

BGC Ponoka

The Boys & Girls Club of Ponoka is looking to start up in Bentley in the fall as a fee for attendance program.

Strathcona County Boys and Girls Club

Strathcona County Boys and Girls Club offers a Before and After School program held at the Boys and Girls Club facility (www.scbgc.com). Strathcona County Family and Community Services does not fund that particular program, however, we do provide funding to the Strathcona County Boys and Girls Club through our Social Framework Community Core grant that sounds very similar to what you're considering. Through our grant we fund their youth programming, ages 12+, including:

Programming for a range of locations including the Youth Hub; programs within schools, and summer pop up locations.

Youth programming during PD days is held at the Youth Hub

The club also provides programming at 4 Junior High schools (urban and rural) for lunch time programming – to help build relationships where the youth are at, and bridge the gap from the schools to the Youth Hub
